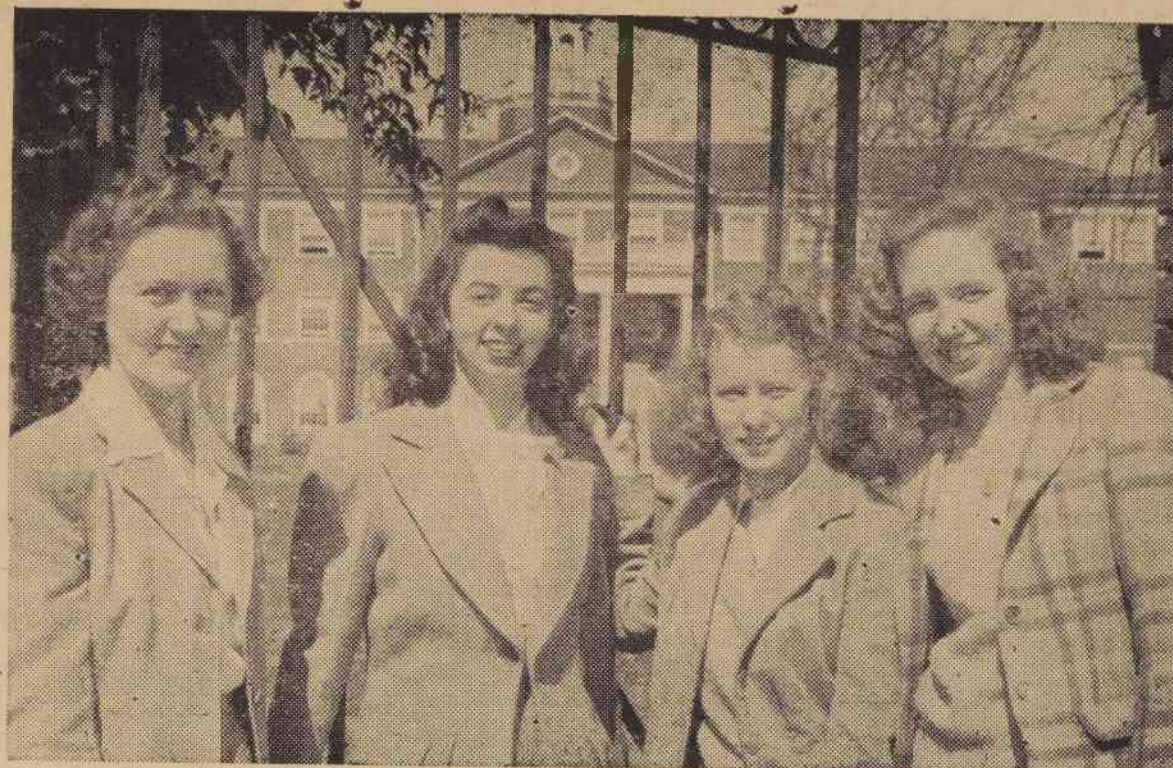


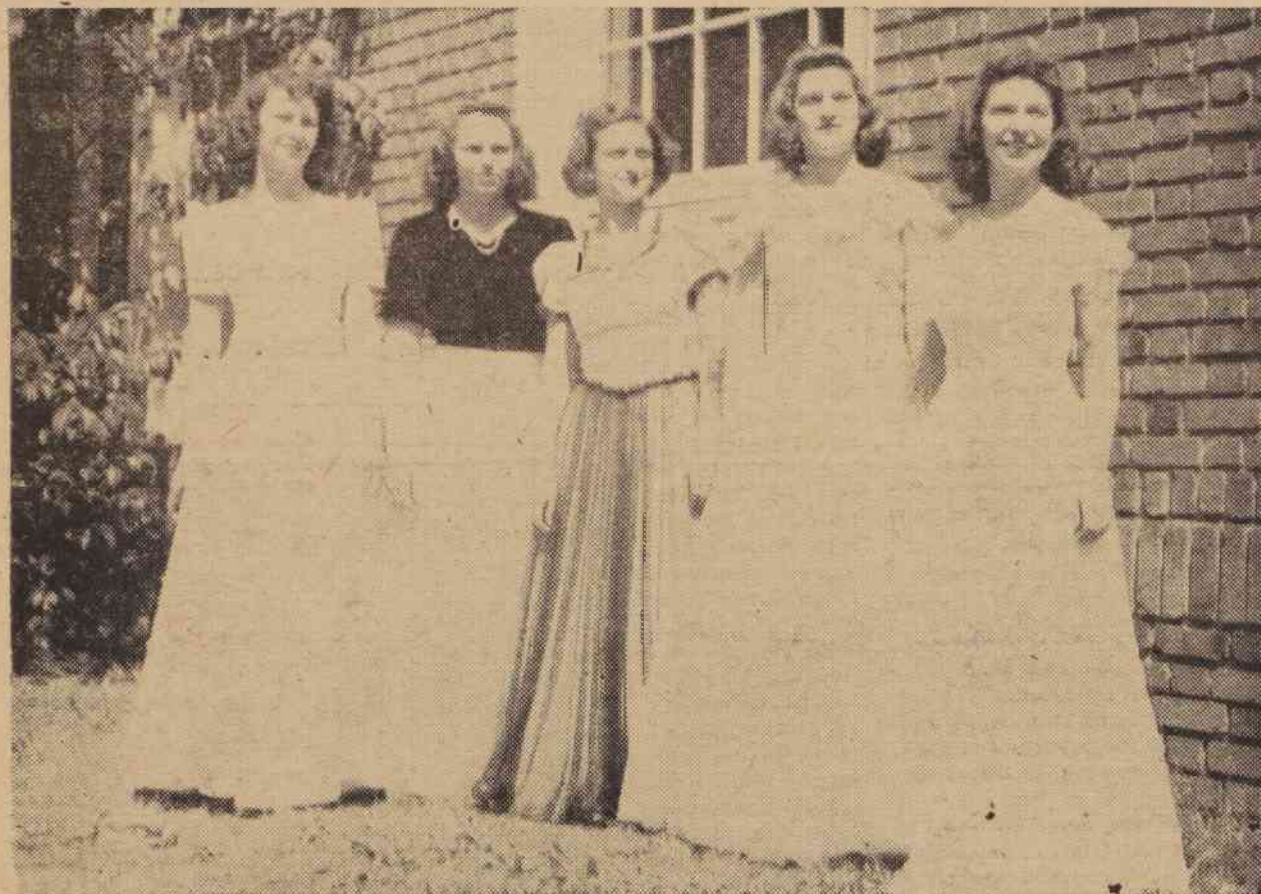
Student Government Heads



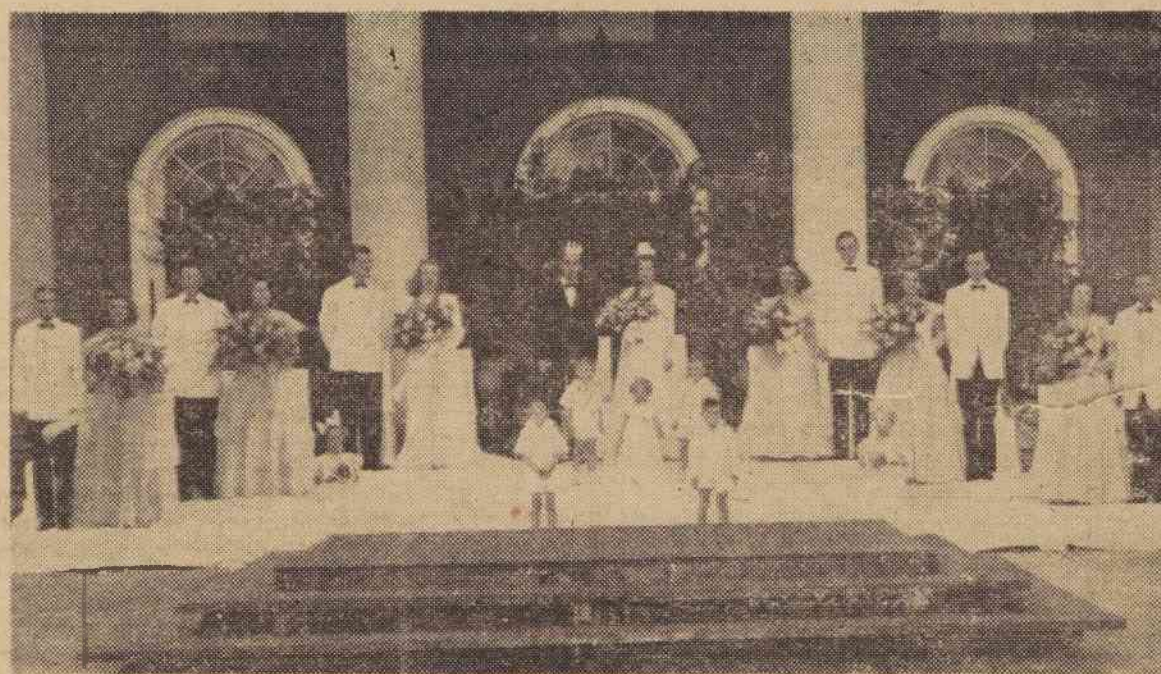

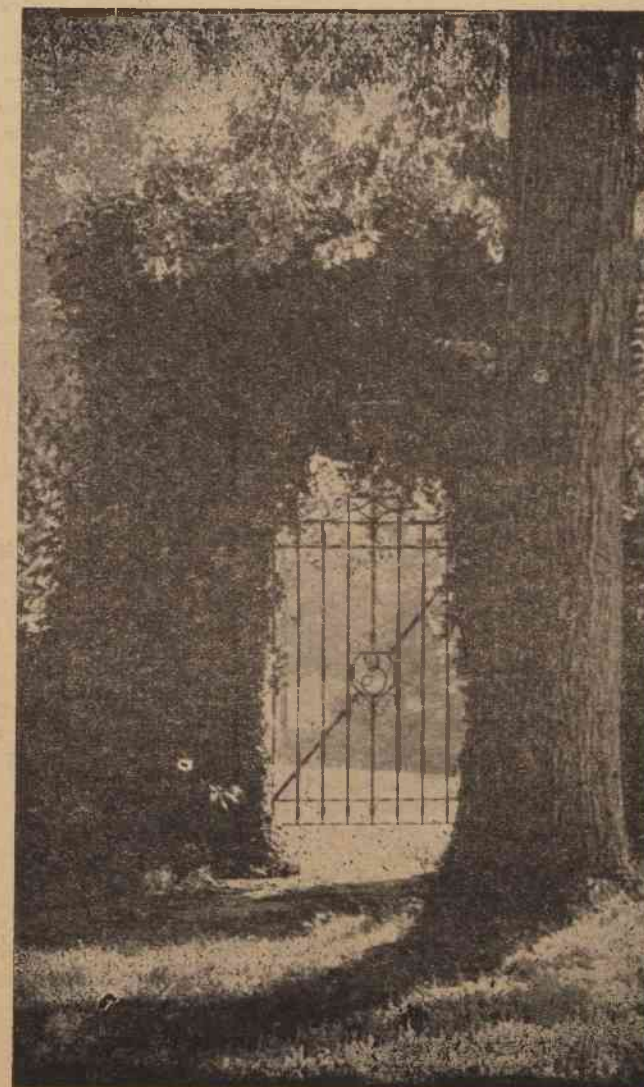
