



# **Christians End Season** With Quakers Saturday

The oldest football rivalry in Elon sports history will be renewed over in Burlington Memorial Stadium on Satorday night, when the Christians will play host to the Guilford Quakers in the final battle of the 1956 grid season.

The Christians and Quakers nave been meeting almost annualy since 1919, and the game Saturday night will be the thirtyfourth in the annual series. The games were played as Thanksgiving Day features for many years tut the old rivals have switched to an earlier date in recent years to avoid conflict with student va cation periods

The Elon squad, which needs win over the Quakers on Saturday to gain an even break of five wins and five losses this year. holds an edge over the Guilfordions in number of victories during the long rivalry. Records disclose that Elon has won 20, lost 10 and ied 3 games in the 37-year old ivalry.

The Guilford contest, with its kick-off slated for 8 o'clock Saturday night, will be the final appearance for eight senior mempers of the Elon grid squad, and he Christians will be going all out to make this "swan song" game of the Elon seniors a victorious one.
