## Varsity Nine **Drops** Game To Catawba

The Catawba Indians eked out a thrilling 3 to 2 win over the Elon Christians at Salisbury on Tuesday, April 14th, when George Schneider bested Gil Watts in a tight pitching duel to hand Elon's defending North State champions their first Conference defeat of the 1959 season.

The Christians broke the scoring ice first with a single run in the first rack, and they added a second marker in the third to take a 2-0 lead. 
