## Bears Tople Elon 10 To 5

The Lenoir Rhyne baseballers chalked their second win of the year over the Elon Christians at Hickory on Monday afternoon, May 7th, staging a rousing six-run rally in the bottom of the third to come from behind and then moved ahead to a 10-5 victory.

The Elon outfit had staged a rally of its own in the top of the third, grabbing what seemed to be a commanding lead when the Christians pushed across four runs on a walk to Ken Cook, followed by Wayne Allen's double and a pair of singles by Jerry Pike and Leroy Myers.

The Lenoir Rhyne Bears, grabbing off seven first places and placing speedy Joe Rhyne as the outstanding individual in the meet, rolled for 69 3-4 points as they captured the 1962 Carolinas Conference track meet at Greensboro on Saturday, May 12th, successfully defending the crown they had won last spring.

The Catawba Indians with 31 3-4 points and the Elon Christians with 28 points were the closest competitors for the Bears. Other team scores were East Carolina 26 1-2, Atlantic Christian 22 3-4, High Point 15 1-2, Guilford 11 1-2, Appalachian 9 1-4 and Newberry 3 1-2.

Willie Tart chalked Elon's single individual win as he took the 440-yard dash, but Dick More paced the Elon scoring with 11 points on seconds in the shot and discus and third in the javelin. Roland Miller counted 8 points in the mile and two-mile, and the Elon relay team was second in that event.

## Freshman Hurler Gains Win Over Pirates Here

Hamering home five runs in a big seventh inning outbreak, the Elon Christians turned back the East Carolina Pirates 5 to 3 in a well-played Carolinas Conference baseball game here Wednesday afternoon, May 9th, a game which was played in less than two hours. It was Elon's first win over the Pirates since 1958.

Jim Leviner, Elon's senior first-sacker, hammered a grand-slam homer inside the park as the big blow of the seventh inning rally. Wayne Allen singled to open the Elon uprising and scored moments later on Steve Wall's single, which left the sacks loaded and set the stage for Leviner's round-tripper.

The game, which was a tight mound duel between Elon's Charles Everett and East Carolina's Nathan Greene, went six innings without a score, but East Carolina broke the ice with a singleton run in the top of the seventh on a single by Tom Brown and a double by Tammy Kidd.

Then came the victory rally by the Christians, which put the game on ice. The Pirates used a walk, a triple and a fielder's choice to plate two runs in the ninth, but Everett then tightened up to require the Pirates without further scores.

Charles Everett, a fine freshman southpaw from Alexandria, Va., struck out only two men, but he had the Pirates popping the ball into the air all afternoon, getting thirteen men on either infield or outfield flies. He scattered six hits well, never allowing more than one safety except the seventh rack.

In addition to Leviner's grand-slam homer, Steve Wall was Elon's top hitter with two singles in four trips. Tommy Kidd, Pirate first baseman, led the visitors with a

The Christians grabbed the lead with a single run in the first frame, and they added two counters in each of the fifth, sixth and seventh frames, most of them coming on well-timed hits. The Catawba nine could not reach home in the early frames but plated two runs in the sixth and eighth for their four-run total.

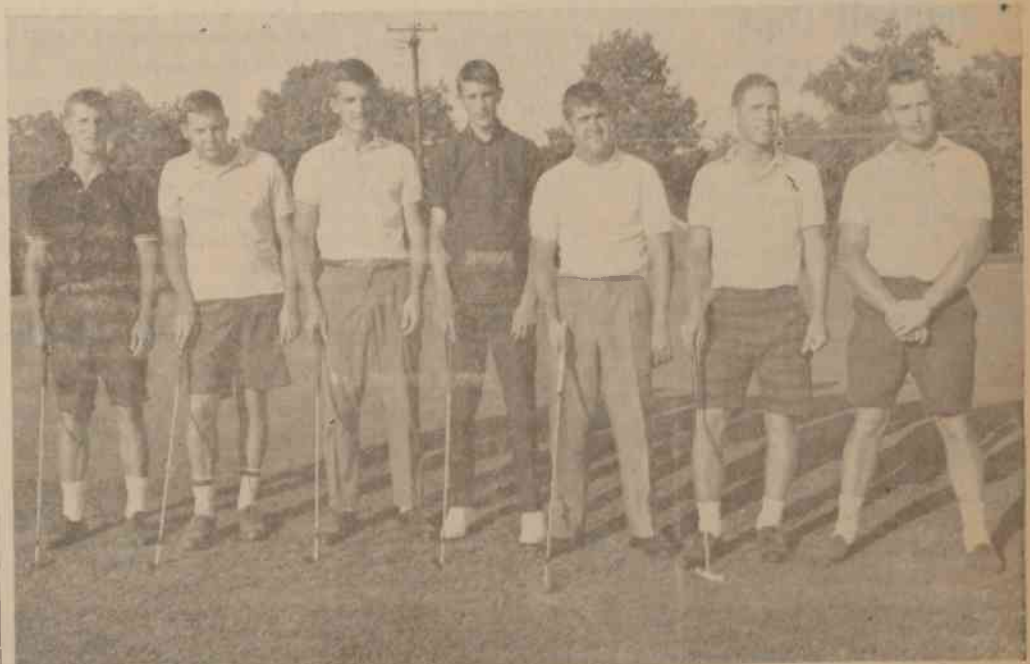
