Two Units Burn; Others Are Smoked

The Veterans Apartments, which ave housed many Elon College narried students in the years since World War II, were hit by a major fire for the first time in their sixteen-year history on Monday morning, February 4th, when a blaze of undetermined origin burned out on apartments and damaged four

There had been minor blazes involving stoves in single apart ments, but the alarm which sound ed about 9 o'clock that morning signalled the first fire in a full init of the collection of frame structures since the converted army barracks buildings were moved to the campus following World War II.

The fire apparently started in an nd apartment, which was occued by Mr. and Mrs. Randy Kesh, neither of whom were at nome at the time.
