In this paper, he will discuss all aspects of teaching from the grade school level to the college professor, and certainly it will touch upon the various rights and freedoms of the teacher, along with the obligations and duties of the same. An ardent advocate of academic freedom, Dr. Cartwright will certainly be open to any and all opinions on that matter; and, since the student at Elon is in fact in the very middle of American education, the opportunity to listen to and speak with Dr. Cartwright is one which should not
