Eight Named In Who's Who

Eight outstanding Elon college students have just been named for places in "Who's Who In American Universities and Colleges," according to information received in the office of Dean Fletcher Moore from the headquarters of the "Who's Who" organization in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

All of the group have been excellent students and have been active in various phases of campus life since enrolling at Elon. The group, chosen for academic ability, campus citizenship, campus leadership and promise of future service in life, includes eight seniors. One of the eight was also honored by "Who's Who" selection as a junior last year. Brief sketches of each are given in alphabetical order.

KENNETH HOLLINGSWORTH -- A senior from Randleman, Hollingsworth has been very active in music, having been a member of the Elon Choir, Elon Quartet, Elon Band and of the Collegium Musicale. He has also served as a SGA Senator, on the public relations Committee and has played in Elon Player productions. He is on the Maroon and Gold staff, is a member of the Order of the Oak and of the Alpha Phi Omega, fraternity of former Boy Scouts.

JAMES LUNSFORD -- A senior from Winston-Salem, Lunsford has been very active with the Liberal Arts Forum, has served in Student Government affairs as a Senator, is a member of the Contemporary affairs Committee and is a mem-

ber of Sigma Mu Sigma fraternity.

MARCIA LUNSFORD -- Also a native of Winston-Salem like her husband, Marcia Lunsford is vice-president of the senior class, a member of the SGA Senate and active in the Liberal Arts Forum. She is a member of Pi Kappa Tau Sorority.

CAROL LUPINACCI -- A native of Stamford, Conn., Carole Lupinacci was also honored by "Who's Who" last year and the only one named a second time this year. She was secretary of her freshman class, a member of the Senate, the Elon Singers, the Women's Dormitory Council, the Statewide Student Legislature, the Inter-Fra-

ternity Council and has

served on both the Spring Weekend and Homecoming committees. She is a member of Pi Kappa Tau Sorority.

LARRY MABE -- A senior from Star, Mabe has been active in Student Government Affairs, serving on the Honor Court and as chairman of the Freshman Orientation Committee this year. He is a member of the French Club and of Alpha Pi Delta.

DALE MORRISON -- A senior from Lynchburg, Va., Dale Morrison has been outstanding in Student Government activities throughout his college years, and he was elected last spring as president of the SGA for this year. He had previously been a member of the Senate and Honor Court and represented

Elon in the Statewide Student Legislature.

RONNIE TUGWELL -- A senior from Arlington, Va., Tugwell has been active in both Student Government affairs and in sports. He has been secretary-treasurer of his class and has served in the Senate. He has also played varsity baseball since his freshman year. He is a member of Kappa Psi Nu Fraternity.

SANDRA WRENN -- A senior from Staley, Sandra is also active in SGA affairs, serving as chairman of the campus board of elections, a member of the Honor Court and a member of the Religious Life Committee. She is also a member of the Order of the Oak and the Baptist Student Union and has served as a commencement marshal.

Elon Sophomore Fatally Hurt In Auto Wreck Near Campus

John Anderson, 19-year old Elon sophomore from Aberdeen, was killed in an automobile accident which occurred on Saddle Club Road about one mile from the campus on Friday night, October 6th.

His death came in a two-car collision which involved five other Elon students, with the compact car in which he was riding cut in half by the impact with the other car.

Young Anderson was one of four persons riding a new compact car that was moving west on Saddle Club road. The car, driven by James Warner, of Glen Olden, Pa., and also occupied by David Bowden and Bruce Duncan, Elon students from Alexandria, Va., went out of control and skidded broadside in the path of the other car.

The second car was moving east, driven by Paul Bleiberg, of Wilmington, Del., and also

occupied by Andrew Morris, of Wadesboro, struck the smaller car on the right side and inflicted the fatal injuries on Anderson, who was reported dead on arrival at Alamance County Hospital.

The drivers of both cars were admitted to the hospital that night for observation and treatment, with Warner receiving lacerations of the forehead and Bleiberg receiving a fractured nose. The other occupants of the two vehicles were treated for minor hurts and released by hospital authorities.

The compact car in which Anderson was riding at the time of his death was cut in half by the impact and termed a total loss with damages estimated at \$3,000. The heavier automobile involved in the crash had estimated \$200 damages.

John Anderson, the dead youth, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. George D. Anderson, of Aberdeen, and funeral services were held at the First Baptist Church in

Aberdeen on Sunday afternoon, October 8th, with burial in Bethesda Cemetery there.

Special memorial services were also conducted for young Anderson in Whitley Memorial Auditorium here at Elon at 10 o'clock on Tuesday morning, October 10th, with the Rev. John S. Graves, campus minister, officiating.
