

BOLTON SMASHES ELON'S ANCIENT POLE VAULT RECORD



It is up and over -- seemingly over the tree tops for Ron Bolton, Elon's freshman pole vaulter from Greensboro, who smashed one of Elon's oldest track records when he leaped 12 feet in the very first meet of the 1968 season, breaking the old mark of 11 feet 6 inches which had been set by John Platt fifteen years ago. Bolton has since cleared 13 feet at the Davidson Relays but did not win first place, so he could not get credit for that height as a record.

PC Trackmen Down Elon 85-60 In Meet

The Presbyterian Blue Stockings grabbed eleven of seventeen first places and took a clean sweep of the high jump as they defeated the Christian cindermen on the Elon track here April 29th by an 85 to 60 score.

This meet was the last home contest on the Elon schedule for the Christians for the season. The Elon cindermen will go to Catawba on Friday for their final dual meet and will later compete in both the NAIA District 26 meet and Conference meet.

The Elon 440-Yard relay quartet set one new Elon record when it won the event in a 44.3 seconds performance. The team included Tom Jernigan, Joe Rinaca, Don Crews and David Oliphant.

Crews Sets Record As Elon Tops AC

Don Crews, Elon freshman sprinter, topped a twelve-year-old Elon record when he ran the 220 yard dash in 22 seconds flat as the feature of the Christian tracksters' 98 to 42 victory over the Atlantic Christian cinder squad at Wilson. Joe Freve also set a new Elon mark of 60 seconds flat in the 440-yard hurdles.

The Christians won thirteen first places in the sixteen events, with Crews, Dave Oliphant and Larry Raines sweeping all three spots in the 100-yard dash, in which Crews had a sparkling 9.9 time.

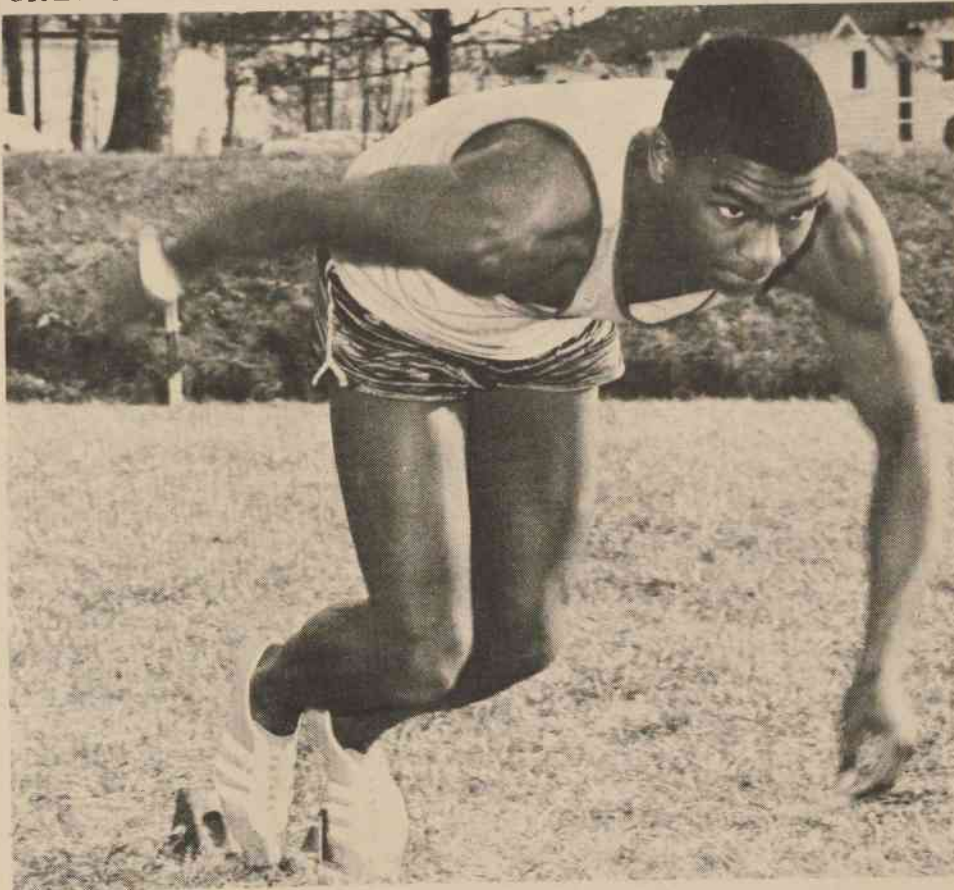

LR Defeats Elon In Tilt Here 2 To 1

The Lenoir Rhyne Bears used a walk and an error in pushing over two unearned runs in the eighth inning came from behind to win a crucial Carolinas Conference baseball battle from Elon by a 1 to 0 count on the Elon field on April 30th.

The Elon outfit got away in front against Lenoir Rhyne yesterday with a solo run in the first inning. With one out, Jim Friesinger singled, advanced on a walk and scored on Joe Byrtus' single.

The 1-0 lead held up for eight innings, with Burgin Beale pitching steady ball all the way, but Dave Matheny walked after one out in the eighth, and Mike McRee

The jet age seemingly arrived on the Elon campus when Don Crews, freshman sprinter from Greensboro, hit the Christian track out beyond the Alumni Memorial Gymnasium. Crews has won double sprint honors in most of Elon's meets this year, and Crews broke the twelve-year old 220-yard dash record set by Eddie Bridges back in 1956 when the Gate City youngster ran the furlong in 22 seconds flat at Atlantic Christian. Crews has been under 10 seconds twice in the century, pushing close to Eddie Bridge's 100 yard mark of 9.8 seconds.

Pfeiffer Tops Elon

Two errors, a walk and a wild pitch before a man was out in the first inning gave Pfeiffer a single run, and that was the only score as the Falcons went on to eke a 1 to 0 victory over the Elon Christians at Pfeiffer on April 26th, with Elon falling victim to a no-hitter by Vic Worry.

After that single unearned run, neither Pfeiffer's Vic Worry nor Elon's John Austin would yield a score as Austin

let the league-leading Falcons down with two widely-spaced singles, only to lose the decision to a no-hitter thrown at Elon by Pfeiffer's ace moundman.

John Austin pitched by far his best game of his freshman season for Elon as he struck out eleven men and walked only three while limiting the Falcons to one single in the third and another in the ninth. After Pfeiffer got
