Arts Group Has Scott As Guest

Dr. Andrew M. Scott, professor of political science at the University of North Carolina, visited the Elon College campus on Wednesday night of this week as the second speaker in the series of lectures sponsored on the campus this year by the Liberal Arts Forum.

A native of California, Dr. Scott is a graduate of Dartmouth College and received the Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Harvard University. He is regarded as an outstanding scholar in the field of international politics.

He is a past president of the International Studies Association and has taught as a Fulbright Professor at the Bologna Center of the Johns Hopkins University in Italy. He is the author of nine books on American politics and in his special field of American foreign policy. He is also the author of many scholarly articles and papers which have appeared in professional magazines in the field of history and political science.
