

### Camels Down Elon

Showing small resemblance to the fast-moving combination that had trampled both Catawba and Guilford in two previous games, the Christian basketball squad experienced perhaps its coldest shooting streak of the year in losing a 97 to 75 battle to the Campbell Camels here on Wednesday night, January 15th.

The game was close for exactly seven minutes, but Campbell pulled ahead at 16-15 at that point, and Elon never caught up again. In the final thirteen minutes of the first half, the Christians could hit only four of twenty-three floor shots for a 17.4 percent average, and that lapse in shooting proved

The Camels were ahead by 18 points with a 44 to 26 score at the half-time, and the sharpshooting visitors widened that margin in the last half to the final 97 to 75 count. The Christians pulled within thirteen points of the visitors a couple of times, but that was the best they could do.

Allen McRae hit 29 points and Cordell Wise 22 points to lead the Camels to their wins, with two of their mates also in double figures. The Elon cagers had five men in the double-digit columns, but none of them could match the shooting of McRae and Wise.

Henry Goedeck and Noble Marshall each hit for 15 points to lead the Llon attack, but neither could hit like they did in battles with Catawba and Guilford. Other Christians in two figures were Tommy Cole with 14, Bill Bowes with 13 and Richand McGeorge with 10 counters.
