

The cast has just been chosen and announced for the forthcoming Elon Player production of Ber-

tolt Brecht's "Three-penny Opera," which will be the next Player production on the campus stage. Tryouts were held recently, and the producion is scheduled as the leature of the spring dra-

matic season. The "Threepenny Ope-ra" is Brecht's satire on bourgoisie corruption In 19th Century London, and it uses thieves, begtars, policemen, prosti-tutes and other characters found in the London society of the period. In the opera Brecht satirizes human corruption

and greed of all periods, using songs set to the brilliant music of Kurt Weill.

The opera productin, to be presented under direction of Prof. Sandy Moffett, and indications point to one of the top stage shows of the year on the campus stage. It will feature a number of very fine songs, best of which is 'Jack The which is 'Jack The Knife," which remained one of America's popular favorites long after it was introduced in the Broadway stage show.

Elon Lyceum Event Set In Whitley

One of the greatest organists in the world to-day will appear on the Elon College campus next Sunday afternoon when Si-mon Preston, organist at Westminster Abbey in England, who is recogniz-ed worldwide as a recital-ist and recording artist will appear in the next of the Elon College Lyceum programs in Whitley Au-ditorium at 4 o'clock. Making his first ap-pearance in this part of the world, Simon Preston will present in recital ganists in the world to-

will present in recital many of the organ numbers which have gained for him worldwide acclaim as an organist. Music critics all over the world have hailed Preston for his magnificent technique and his fine sense of rhythm. Simon Preston was born in Bournemouth,

England, in 1938 and went to Choir School of King's College, Cambridge, College, Cambridge, where he was chorister under Boris Ord.

He then went to Canford School and later to he Royal Academy of Music where he studied the organ with C. H. Trevor. In 1958, he was awarded the Dr. Mann Organ Stu-dentship at King's Col-lege, Cambridge, where where he returned to work under David Willcocks, and where he obtained both the M.A. and the

both the M.A. and the Mus. B. degrees. As a sub-organist at Westminster Abbey until just recently, he had established himself as one of the most brilliant of the younger generation of the younger generation of organists. He has given recitals throughout the British Isles, and in 1965 made his first tour of the United States and Canada, winning great acclaim in both countries.

During the season of 1967-68, he substituted as Master of Music at the Cathedral and Abbey Church of St. Alban. In addition to having six solo addition to having six solo long-play records to his credit, he has recently finished making a film on organ in the series en-titled "We Make Music."

Simon Preston's interests are not solely confined to the organ, for he is well known on television in England as the conductor of the "New conductor of the "New English Singers" and has a growing reputation as a harpsichord player. A number of compositions also testify to his ability as a composer. Preston has won high praise from newspaper
