Christopher Brookhouse, professor, author and movie critic, entertained English

majors, professors and other interested people by reading some of his poems and a story on Tuesday afternoon.

"A meet the author" reception was held before the reading when refreshments were served in the large lounge, Student Center.

Dr. Brookhouse read several of his earlier poems including "The Wolves," "The Finding," "The Man in the Ocelot Suit," and "Mobile." He then read a short story entitled *The Pilots*.

After his readings, Dr. Brookhouse responded to questions asked by the audience. In his answers, he said that he is influenced mainly by movies and two authors — Norman Mailer and Flannery O'Connor. He said that writing poems is more tense than writing short stories because short story writing is extended over a period of time.

Dr. Brookhouse is now working on another novel and teaching one course in creative writing at Elon.
