John F. Mitchell is named new administrative vice-president

John F. Mitchell, vice president for administration and finance at Tufts University in Medford, Mass., has been named vice president for administrative services at Elon College.

Mitchell will join the Elon staff on June 1 in the newly created position. He will be responsible for several administrative functions, and will report to President Fred Young.

Mitchell received an A.B. degree in economics and history from Dartmouth

College, and an M.B.A. from the Amos Tuck School of Business Administration at Dartmouth. He has also taken additional courses at the University of Omaha, the University of Wisconsin, and Tufts University.

He joined the Tufts University staff in 1958 as assistant to the comptroller. In 1964 he was named comptroller and business officer before taking a similar position at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Conn. He returned to Tufts in 1966 as

business officer and secretary of the corporation. After serving as vice president for business affairs, he was named to his present position in 1977.

During the last four years at Tufts he established and managed a multi-school budget development and control system for the school's \$70-million operation. He managed a successful \$15-million tax-exempt bond issue and secured \$6 million in federal
