

Soccer team wins twice

The Elon soccer team won two of three contests last week, downing East Carolina University and Guilford College before succumbing to Atlantic Christian College

on Monday. The team's record now stands at 2-3 overall and 1-1 in Carolinas Conference play.

Freshman Chip Callaway scored the only goal as the

Fighting Christians prevailed 1-0 in a tight defense struggle at East Carolina. At Guilford, goals by Callaway, Chris Crusan, Joe Chisholm, and Jeff Shields led the booters to a 4-2 win. Chisholm, a junior from New York City, drilled home Elon's only goals in a 3-2 loss to Atlantic Christian. For his three goals and three assists, Chisholm was named Carolinas Conference Player of the Week.

The team will travel later in the week to take on North Carolina Wesleyan College at 3:30 on Sept. 28, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill on Sept. 30 at 3 p.m.

This year Elon's Golden Girls volleyball team is in the District 26 NAIA conference, which includes 21 other schools. According to coach Karen Carden, "We will be playing teams which we haven't played in the past. All these schools are tough and very competitive, which will make our team work harder to win."

The team has been practicing since Sept. 7. The emphasis has been on quickness and footwork, which will "get you a lot of shots that would normally be left untouched," coach Carden says.

"The players should be in good physical condition to play in three matches in a row and still stay mentally

strong," said Coach Carden.

She hopes to improve last year's record of 22-15. She says the team is stronger than last year's because five players return.

Of 12 players on the team, seven are newcomers. Two are transfer students--Phyllis Wardlaw from High Point College and Jeanie Augustine from UNC-G.

Susan Overbee, who didn't play last year as a freshman "will definitely be playing this year as a setter," says Coach Carden. A setter is a key position because she prepares the ball for the spike or getting the ball over the net. Jeanie Hairston and Barbara Carter will "spark" up the team with their offensive abilities, Carden predicts.
