

AAUP plans state conference for October 9, 10

The North Carolina Conference of the American Association of University Professors will be held at Elon College on Oct. 9 and 10, Dr. Fred Watts, state president, has announced. Dr. Watts is associate professor of political science at the college.

Members of the organization will hear three special speakers during the fall conference. Dr. Mary Gray, professor of mathematics, statistics, and computer science at American University, Washington, D.C., will give the keynote speech at a

dinner to be held in McEwen Dining Hall on Friday evening, Oct. 9. Dr. Gray is a candidate for president of the national AAUP.

John Henley, president of the N.C. Council of Private Colleges and Universities and a former state senator, will speak on Saturday morning at Best Western Motel, Burlington, after the business meeting. Henley and a representative from the public universities will address the question of state assistance to private college and university students.

After registration Friday,

from 4 to 6 p.m., delegates will attend a reception at Priestley Fine Art Gallery, 100 North Williams Va., from 6 to 7:30, before the dinner in McEwen. Dr. James Pace, assistant professor of religion, is president of the Elon College Chapter of AAUP.

The keynote speaker, Dr. Gray, received the A.B. in mathematics and physics (summa cum laude) from Hastings College, the M.A. and Ph.D. in mathematics at the University of Kansas, and the J.D. at American

University's Washington College of Law (summa cum laude). She received the Georgina Smith Award from AAUP in 1979. She is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi, and Alpha Chi.

Dr. Gray will describe how she believes AAUP can best preserve the principles and standards which have been established over many years in a period of reduced federal spending and a time of uncertainty in academe.

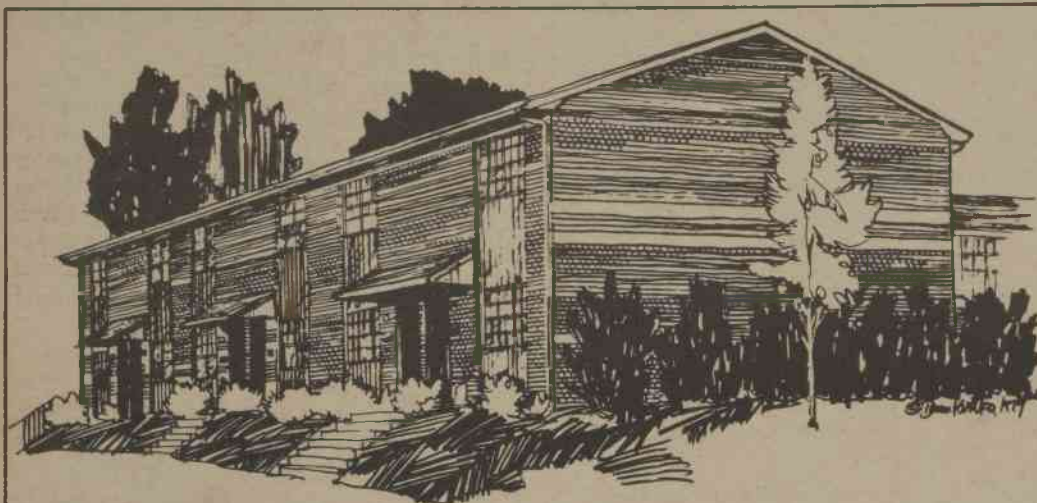

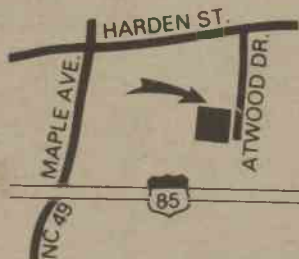
