This course concentrates on planning, writing and editing the employee publication for corporations as well as publications for non-profit organizations such as the United Way and the American Red Cross. Because business communicators often must be responsible for additional print

media, part of the course work covers the production of brochures, annual reports for employees, and special newsletters.

Speakers and panelists from the Business Department, from industries and non-profit agencies visit the class to bring current ideas and practice to the students. All class members work on a publication during the term and create a complete mockup of a publication for the final examination. Dr. Mary E. Priestley teaches the course.
