Then, after Jonas Davis lost another fumble at the Elon 26, Lee rifled the ball to Jamison between two Elon defenders in the end zone, making it 13-12. But Elon's Jeff Knox knocked down the ensuing two-point conversion pass, and Bowie State would get no closer.

In the third quarter, following a Bulldogs' punt into the wind that carried only seven yards, Elon moved from the hosts' 44 to the four, where Davis coughed up the ball yet again. However, with 2:15 left in the period, the Christians' Jeff Cooper sacked Lee, whose fumble was recovered by Bob LeBlanc at the Bowie State seven. Two plays later Fromhart fired to Stanley, who made a diving catch in the end zone, and Thorne's kick made it

The Bulldogs made one more threat in the fourth quarter, moving inside the Elon 35 before Angel made his second interception of the day.

The Christians' final scoring drive covered 80 yards, with Fromhart passing to Simmons from the 10 for the score and Thorne converting again at 4:26 remaining in the game.
