

Christian nine finds groove near post-season games

The Fightin' Christian baseball team, after losing back-to-back crucial games against High Point College, has found a late season groove by winning the last five games, including two doubleheader sweeps.

Playing up to their potential, the Christian nine hosted North Carolina A & T on Tuesday and continued their late-season success by sweeping the Aggies.

In the first game, sophomore transfer Greg McDannold struck out 17 batters in Elon's 10-1 destruction of A & T. He had a no-hitter through six and one-third innings of the seven-inning game.

Elon was just as tough in the second game as Craig Holman

fashioned a two-hitter over five innings before surrendering the final two innings to reliever Mike Scott. The combination of these pitching aces stopped the Aggies in an 8-0 victory.

Last Thursday, the Christians traveled to High Point to face a scrappy Panther team that turned back the Elon nine, 5-4. On Friday, High Point came to Newsome Field and skipped away in a strong performance with an 11-6 win over the Christians. Those two straight losses left the Elon team with an even 12-12 record and a dim outlook for the post-season.

With their backs against the wall and facing a possible losing record, the Christians regrouped and swept a doubleheader from Mars Hill College on Saturday afternoon by scores of 5-1 and 9-5.

Then on Sunday, and playing their fifth game in four days, the Elon nine shut down the Indians of Catawba College behind the six-hit pitching of sophomore Craig Harris. Harris got a big boost from Frank "Pee Wee" Manship when the veteran third-baseman smashed a three-run homer in the fourth inning.

The Christians will now take a week off before traveling to Gardner-Webb College for a doubleheader on Wednesday. Next Friday (27th), the Elon nine will host Shaw University before concluding their regular season at home on Saturday (28th) against St. Augustines College.

The Fightin' Christians' record now stands at a respectable 17-12, with five regular season games remaining.

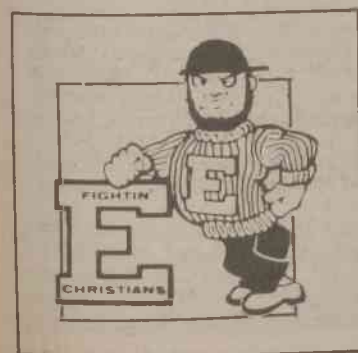
like to see the community more informed as to what WSOE can do for them.

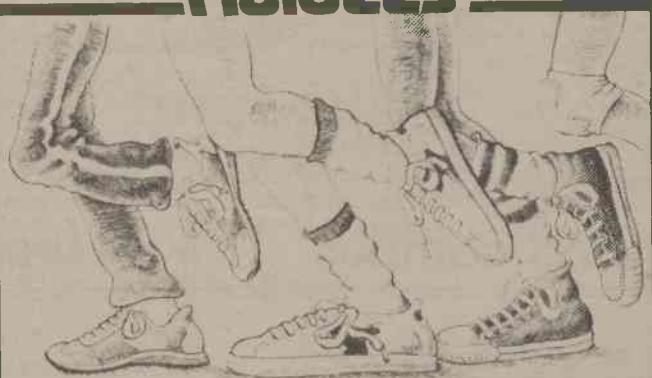
Temple said, "We want an overall theme to the yearbook next year that will be apparent throughout the book."
