only nine individuals were arrested," said Elon College Police Chief Dan Ingle. He said "If you ask me if I feel there is a serious drug problem—I'd say no. I don't feel like its any more serious than anywhere else in the state."

Ingle said the operation started last September as a result of "complaints from citizens, students and teachers (at Elon) about drug dealing in the Elon area."

Klepczyk said there is a real interest in the part of the police in cleaning it up and the college supports that goal.

Ingle said he talked with Klepczyk on several occasions and said that "Klepczyk and his staff had been very helpful."

The *Greensboro News and Record* last Sunday quoted Gibsonville detective Morris McPhearson as saying that the officers seized, during the sweep of arrests, cars, rolling papers, water pipes and "a good ounce" of marijuana.

Klepczyk said however that this incident may be providing opportunities for students to examine their own values concerning drugs and alcohol. "There may be some real positive things going on," he said. Hopefully, less people will be involved in the future, Klepczyk said.

He said that what the college is trying to do to deal with problems such as these is to form more programs which aim at making students aware of the responsible choices they can make towards drugs and alcohol.

On drug related violations, Elon works with the Alamance County Mental Health Center according to Klepczyk. The students, if found guilty, have to attend courses for which they pay.

He said Elon hopes to have a program next fall for all entering students to talk a little about drugs and alcohol— "things they may face as independent students away from home for the first time," said Klepczyk.

In relation to the term of "double jeopardy" where a student gets punished from both the institution and the law, Klepczyk said that "the college reserves the right to do that."

"If the students are found guilty, we do have a responsibility to respond to that type of behavior," Klepczyk said. The school also has a responsibility "to protect and look out for everyone in the college community."

Ingle said that the operation made great progress with drug trafficking in this area but he says he is aware that not all has been stopped.

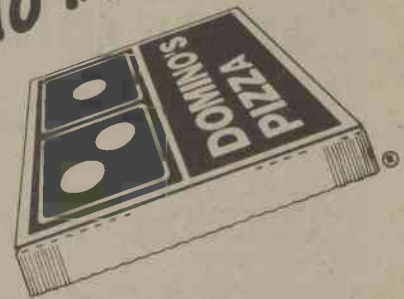
