United Way coordinators seek student participation

With the United Way Fund Raising Drive already under way in Alamance County, Elon College is also gearing up for its annual United Way effort, beginning with an organizational meeting for the student fund raising effort on Sept. 16 at 4:30 p.m. in the Long Student Center second floor lounge.

Dr. Linda Weavil, Assistant Professor of Office Administration and Business Administration, is the director of Elon's United Way Drive.

She said this year's goal is \$8,200, a 10 percent increase over last year's goal.

Greeks and other student organizations raised over \$900

last year, with Sigma Pi winning the trophy for most money collected by an organization.

However, Weavil says most contributions came from faculty and staff and she would like to see more student participation.

Assistant Dean of Student Affairs Valarie Luko, who is working with SGA President Shane Jones in coordinating the student effort for fund raising, agreed with Weavil.

"We're not looking at increasing the amounts of money as much as we are in getting more people involved," said Luko.

Of the 48 organizations recognized by the college, seven contributed to last year's drive and only one residence hall out of 20 contributed Luko said.

She said both she and Jones would like to see some fund raising coordinated with Homecoming in the form of such things as marathons.

The United Way contributes to 34 local agencies, many of which can be utilized by Elon students.

According to Weavil and Luko, these agencies include Rape Crisis Alliance, Suicide and Crisis Services of Alamance, the Christian Counseling Center, Drug and Alcohol Abuse Services, the Mental Health Association and the Y.M.C.A.
