Although the NAAIA's eligibility committee eventually declared Cuda eligible, the quarterback has remained No. 3 at the position behind starter Mike Brodowicz, who has played unexpectedly well, and sophomore reserve Garrett Robinson, who also sees a great deal of action.

In 1982, Cuda was riding a crest. He led his High School team from Summerville, S.C., to a 13-1 record. Recruiters from such college football powers as Georgia, Ohio State, UNC, and

Goalie Ken Markosky turned in another solid performance, shutting out Fort Bragg in the first quarter and making many point-blank saves before he was replaced by Chris Bell. Bell played a solid quarter by allowing only one goal to be scored in the final 15 minutes of play.

Final Elon scoring was four goals by Bond; Farrell, Sean Harlow, Bob Landrum, and Bill Frezier, two goals each; Kirt Zeberlain, Sean Haase, Ross Stevens, Mike Sher, Jonathan Davis, Carlson, Pomeroy, Howie and Allen Porter, one goal each.

real nice. It reminds me of Alabama."

Cuda sighed, "I've had enough publicity."

He has had a long layoff from football. He said he is trying to improve at the quarterback position constantly, and would like to be able to say, "I did something better today."

"Every player on the team has been nice. I haven't been treated

like an outsider," says Cuda. "Coach Carden has been patient. They (the coaches) just want me to do my best."

"I feel we have a good team," says Cuda when asked about Elon's chances this year. One thing he enjoys about the Fightin' Christians is that there are "no individual stars. We play together as a team."
