Assault charges dropped

The assault charges against a former Elon student, charged as an accomplice in the beating of an elderly Elon College resident last May, have been dismissed by Alamance County District Attorney George Hunt.

Hunt dropped the charges against Thomas Brennan after authorities determined that he had played an essential role in preventing Celia Hodge from receiving further injury when she was attacked by another Elon student, Arthur Griffin. At his trial Griffin testified that he was intox-
