# Wallace captures first place at the Duke Invitational

Elon's track team traveled to Duke University on March 12 for the Duke Invitational track meet. In a field, which consisted of seven teams, Elon came out with one first place finish, two second, and two third place finishes.

The most impressive finish of the day for Elon was on the part of Warren Wallace, who finished first in the long jump with a leap of 23' 3 1/2".

Willy Williams, Jeff Lazenby, George Dixon, and Stanley Hairston placed second in the men's 4X100 meter relay with a combined time of 42.9 seconds.

Elon also came out with a strong showing in the 100 meter dash, taking the second, third, and fourth place finishes. Dixon came in second with a time of 10.9 seconds, followed by Lazenby, who had a time of 11.0, and coming in fourth place was Hairston who finished the race at the 11.1 mark.

The only other Elon runner to place in the top three was Anthony Wilson, who finished third in the 110 meter High Hurdles with a time of 15.2 seconds.

Elon has a week off for spring break before returning to action in a meet against High Point and Lynchburg at High Point College on April 8.
