"Students who apply for the winter term in London must be in good standing," Dr. Rich explained. "A student's GPA is not the only factor considered in deciding who will be accepted to go to England," he said.

A \$25 fee, refundable until Oct. 1, is required for all applicants. On Oct. 1, \$800 is due and on Nov. 1, the balance is due. A \$50 cancellation fee is charged after Dec. 1.

Forty applicants have already been accepted.

For anyone interested in participating in this study, it is advisable to apply right away.

In addition to the winter term abroad, Elon offers a fall term in London. Applications are presently being accepted. Professor Lamar Bland of the English department and five students are in England for the current semester. It is more difficult to be accepted for participa-

tion in the fall semester. Not only is a check of your grades made, but a reference from students' professors and advisors are also required.

The total cost of the fall term in London equals the cost of a semester at Elon plus airfare. Students take 12 to 16 hours of work as they would here. The term begins on Aug. 25. Students return Dec. 15. Anyone interested in either term should contact Dr. Rich in Alamance 109.

After clearing zoning regulations with the town board of aldermen, major renovations began in order to have the Baxter House ready for the incoming freshmen. The college had to install heating and air conditioning facilities, enlarge bathrooms, put locks on the doors, and paint inside and outside the house and furnish the rooms.
