# Faculty stage counter-protest against Klan

A silent protest took place while the Ku Klux Klan, a group advocating white supremacy, marched Seturday afternoon in Burlington and Gibsonville. Several Elon faculty, staff and members of the community held signs and balloons saying, "Love your neighbor" on street corners along the march route.

The march route in Burlington was comprised of a seven-block rectangle on Front, Worth, Maple and Spring streets. "Most of the people from the community were there out of curiosity, not to support the KKK," said Dr. James Pickens, associate professor of psychology. "This march is the first one in 25 or 30 years, according to Burlington police," he added.

"There are still people and students who want to stand for what is good and beautiful," said Dr. Carole Chase, associate professor of religion and chair of the department of religion.

"In the 1970s students were active in social protests," she continued. "In the 1980s it seems the major and the best paying job are the concerns. I hope this protest indicates there are students interested in social concerns. I was pleased with the student turnout."

### Kappa Alpha loses charter, charged with pledge hazing

Kappa Alpha fraternity has been suspended from Elon College until the fall of 1987 for what school officials have said is "hazing" of the Kappa Alpha fall 1986 pledge class.

The incident which resulted in this action apparently was wittnessed by college President Fred Young when it occured last month on the athletic practice field behind North Dorm.

The fraternity's charter has also been removed by the Kappa Alpha national organization, also until next fall. Members of the fraternity contend they were doing nothing more than leading their pledges through calisthenics on the evening in question.

The penalties for the KA brothers and pledges will varry according to whether each person chooses an administrative hearing or goes before the Elon Hearing Board, which consists of three students and two faculty members.

Some of the KA members and pledges have already choosen the administrative hearing; these students have been suspended from Winter Term
