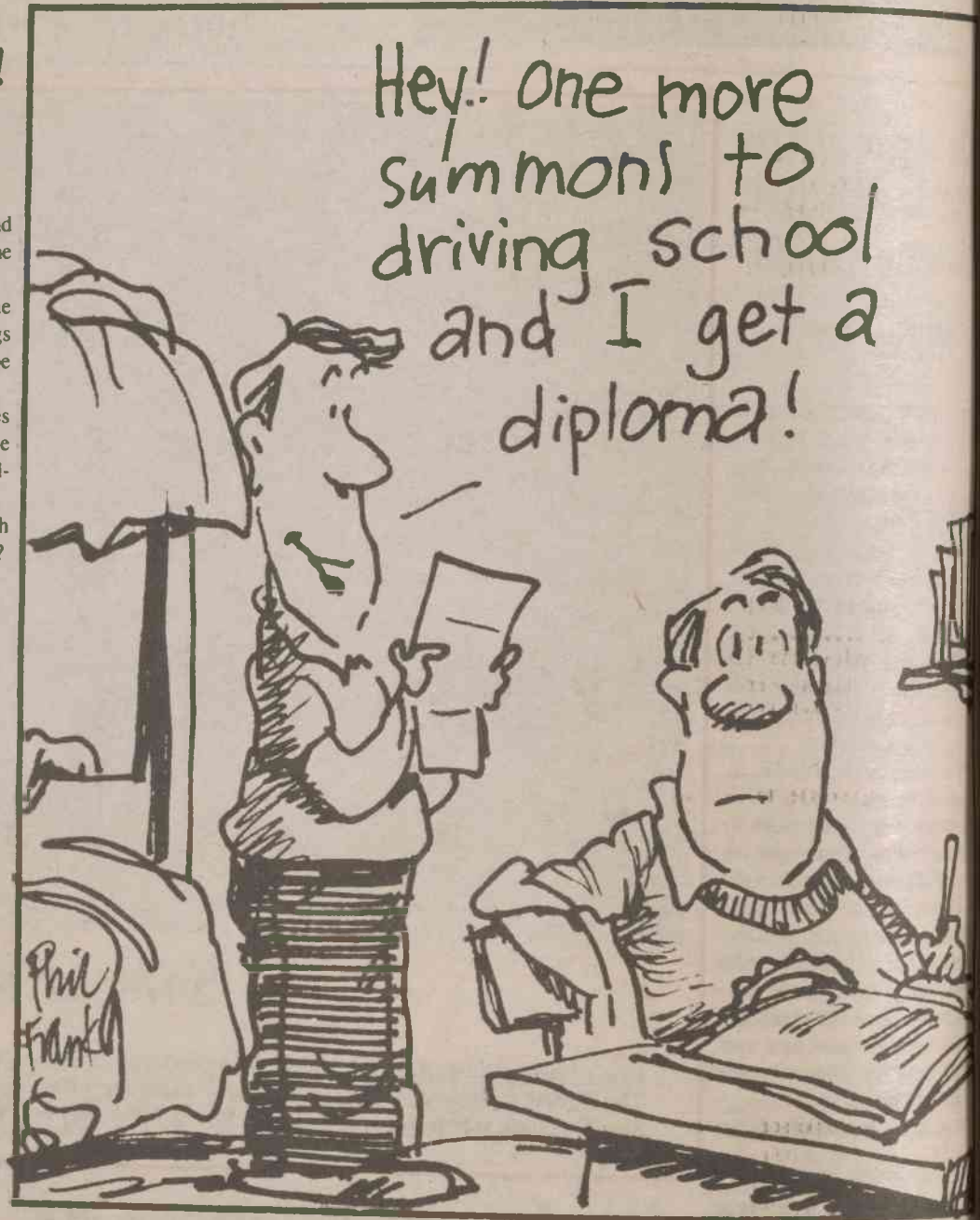
Student expresses thanks to those who gave blood
