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## Campus Dining Changes

This summer, while Elon students enjoyed the relaxation of vacation, the ARA staff began making preparations for substantial changes in the campus food services. Among the changes are a new non-alcoholic tavern called the "New Back Door" and renovations to the Varsity Grill.

Bill Butler, director of Elon's ARA food services, and staff members of the student affairs department had discussed working together to create a campus hangout for students. During August, construction began in Harper Center for the "New Back Door". Food, such as pizza, hot-

dogs, ice cream, subs and soft drinks will be served, and entertainment provided by live bands and a juke box.

Ed Davidson, supervisor of the New Back Door, and 10 student workers have made preparations for promotional events, games and a delivery service that will begin on September, 7. The grand opening has been postponed due to lack of electricity, but the "New Back Door" will be open seven days a week from 4 p.m. until 12 midnight.

"I think the Back Door is going to be the "in" place to be on campus," said Butler. "I just hope the students come in, turn the music up and get down."

Renovations have also been

made in the Varsity Grill to provide the staff, faculty and commuters with an enjoyable place to spend their free time. The Grill's menu has been changed to include house salads, sandwiches, and pizza by the slice. New equipment has been installed, painting is being completed, and the grills atmosphere is a modern contemporary decor, which will provide it's vistors with an "enjoyable, relaxing atmosphere." says Butler.

The Grill's hours have also been extended to provide the college with a great place to just sit down and absorb Elon's atmosphere.

## TKE Complains Evidence Flawed

The Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity lost its recognition on campus for what Greg Martin, a brother of Tau Kappa Epsilon, calls "circumstantial evidence."

The fraternity has lost its recognition by Elon College for five years following an investigation by the State Bureau of Investigations for drug use and theft at the fraternities annual banquet in Nags Head, NC.

After the students left the Armada hotel, where they were staying, the SBI was supposedly call-


ed in to investigate the theft of some "costume jewelry", said Nan Perkins, Director of Public Information at Elon.

According to Perkins there was "substantial evidence of drug use" as the jewelry was never found in any of the rooms belonging to the fraternity brothers, but traces of cocaine and marijuana were.

"The doors to the rooms were open and people were wandering in and out. Even younger people who worked for the hotel were wandering around", says Martin.

Chief of Police, Dan W. Ingle said that the Elon College Police
