Fountain coins provide assistance

The wishes may or may not come true, but the pennies tossed into Fonville Fountain provide scholarship assistance to needy Elon College students.

Since the fountain was added in 1982, over \$50 in coins, mostly pennies, has been retrieved by

workers who give the fountain an occasional cleaning.

All of the coins retrieved from the "wishing well" are washed, counted and sorted. The funds are deposited into the Elon Scholarship Fund, which provides tuition assistance in the form of scholarships to deserving students.
