Jones named USA baseball team coach

Head baseball coach Rick Jones, has been selected as the pitching coach of the 1990 USA National Basebail Team. Jones will be coaching under Georgia Tech Head Coach and Elon Alumnus Jim Morris, who was named head coach of the national team by the U.S. Baseball Federation.

Jones, who has a career 276-94-1 record in his eight years of coaching and a 174-60 record in his five years at Elon, has taken the Fightin' Christians to four District 26 Championships, two Area 7 championships and three NAIA World Series appearances.

"It's an honor to represent your country," said Jones. "It will be a challenge to maintain the Elon program to the level we are used to with these other commitments. I expect the coming year to be rewarding, but demanding."

The team begins play in the Presidents Cup Tournament in

Taiwan from Oct. 28-Nov. 12. In July the team will travel to Seattle where they will compete in the Goodwill Games from July 25-Aug. 1.

How bad are the **Dallas Cowboys?**

Like them or not, the 1989 edition of "America's Team" are possibly the worst team to come down the pike in years (fans of the early Tampa Bay Bucs, take heart). Dallas Cowboy faithfuls are scratching their heads and muttering to themselves, "What's wrong with this picture?" Head Coach Jimmy Johnson is apparently having trouble making the transition from Saturdays in the Orange Bowl with pep bands, fight songs, and one-sided victories; the offensive line and both Aikman and backup QB Steve Walsh have already seen more sacks than an Idaho potato bagger. Simple mathematics will tell that is very difficult to score points, much less win football games when penalty yards exceed total offensive yards.



Former head coach Tom Landry, sensing that his days as the only head coach in Dallas Cowboys' history were numbered, stated that he would stay on as head coach until the Cowboys got back on the winning track. I have no crystal ball, but I suspect that Tom would have to outlive a sea turtle before that would happen.

Any solutions to the dilemma in the land of nighttime soaps? For starters, Dallas must trade for an offensive lineman in the Jim Lachey/Anthony Munoz mold - neither Walsh nor Aikman can throw with their faces buried in the turf. Hershel Walker needs to carry the ball more (more than Eric Dickerson) and do something when he gets it. Tom Rafferty needs to call it a career, and Ed "Too Tall" Jones ought to contemplate a career in professional wrestling. A thorough knowledge of the rules of the game could keep the Cowboys from reeling backwards two steps for every single step forward
