to make changes just for the sake of making them," Frail said.

"The president of the SGA must possess a very dedicated attitude because he faces lots of hard work," said David Atkins, advisor to the SGA. "Outside of classes, this job will be his top priority."

Sophomore Carter Smith defeated Jeff Burrus by a 281-147 margin to become executive vice president of the SGA.

Kevin Arnold and Kathy Miller tied at 145 votes in the race to become executive treasurer. Atkins predicted that a runoff would be held on April 19.

Sophomore Chris Clews defeated John Barnhill in the race to become president of the junior class by a 73-65 margin. Clews credits his success to his campaigning. "I think people were impressed that I took the time to

campaign in front of Long Student Center for five hours in coat and tie. I think this swayed some undecided voters in my direction," Clews said.

In the only other contested race for class officer, Michele Lafrance defeated Nicole Tubbs by a 77-57 margin to win junior class vice president.

Of the 3,120 students enrolled at Elon College, only 470 voted in Tuesday's election. The number represents 6.64% of the student body.

"The students were not willing to wait in the long lines. Voting was a time-consuming process because many candidates were running for each office," said Atkins. "Thirty-two candidates for 16 positions in the student senate are the largest numbers that I have seen in my time at Elon." Atkins said long lines will be avoided in the future with the addition of more voting machines.
