NORTH CAROLINA ISSUES	<i>Harvey Gantt's Record</i>	<i>Jesse Helms' Record</i>
ENVIRONMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SUPPORTS the Clean Air Act. • OPPOSES clear-cutting and below-cost timber sales. • SUPPORTS clean-up of ground & surface water and toxic waste dumps. • PROMOTES energy conservation, recycling, and resource recovery. • OPPOSES off-shore drilling for N.C. • Wants the state of N.C. to provide more information to the public concerning the Southeast Compact hazardous waste dump. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One of only 11 Senators to vote against the Clean Air Act of 1990. • Supports clear-cutting and got WNC's National Forests removed from a national experiment to eliminate below-cost (money-losing) timber sales. • Voted 3 times AGAINST the clean-up of toxic waste dumps, at least 5 times AGAINST funds to implement the Clean Water Act, and AGAINST the clean-up of water treatment plants. • In 1988 received a ZERO rating on environmental issues from League of Conservation Voters. 10% in 1989 and never more than 28% in 17 years in the Senate.
EDUCATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SUPPORTS education of our children as a key aspect of our national security and economic success. • SUPPORTS early childhood education programs such as Head Start and reading programs. • SUPPORTS student loans and grants, with safeguards to ensure payment. • SUPPORTS investments in programs like Head Start which, dollar for dollar, is one of the most successful and cost-effective pre-school programs ever. For every \$1 spent, it saves society \$6 later by avoiding the costs of legal and educational problems. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Voted to cut the Education Appropriation Bill by \$400 million at a time when N.C.'s SAT scores are the lowest in the nation. • ONLY Senator to vote AGAINST re-authorizing student and college financial aid through 1991. • Voted AGAINST the Educational Excellence Act of 1990, voted AGAINST the Elementary Education Improvement Act, and voted AGAINST the Future Teachers Training Corps Fellowship Program. • Received a ZERO rating from the National Education Association 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989.
HOUSING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SUPPORTS anti-discrimination laws in housing. • SUPPORTS complete clean-up of S&L industry and prosecution of those responsible. • Initiated Charlotte's nationally acclaimed scattered-site housing programs. • Built public housing in Charlotte with no federal housing grants. • Created Housing Partnership organization in Charlotte to build and maintain affordable housing. • Advocates Stepping Stones program to help people move up from public housing to private homes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One of only 3 Senators to vote AGAINST the 1988 bill HR1158 which outlaws discrimination in housing for handicapped citizens, families with children under the age of 18, older citizens and on the basis of race, color, creed, and sex. • Voted to allow M. Danny Wall to continue to supervise the S&L industry despite the evidence of widespread mismanagement. • Supported amendment to bill S. 825 to eliminate seed money designed to stimulate the private sector to build and rehabilitate family dwellings in depressed areas.
HUMAN RIGHTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SUPPORTS Hate Crimes Statistics Act, which calls for collecting and publishing data on crimes motivated by racial, religious, or sexual orientation prejudices. • SUPPORTS Voting Rights Act. • SUPPORTS the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. national holiday. • His whole life, public and private, reflects a commitment to human dignity, compassion, justice and fair play. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One of only 4 Senators to vote AGAINST the Hate Crimes Statistics Act. • One of only 6 Senators to vote AGAINST the handicapped access bill known as the Civil Rights Act for Disabled Americans. • Has never supported the Voting Rights Act. • Opposes the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. national holiday.
FAMILY VALUES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strongly SUPPORTS safe, dependable, accessible day care, and supports tax credits for businesses that offer employee day care. • Strongly SUPPORTS the successful Women, Infants, Children (WIC) nutrition program. • SUPPORTS the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1990 which guarantees unpaid leave for new parents and workers with family medical emergencies. • On Abortion—Holds that no law or Constitutional Amendment should be passed that would take away the individual woman's freedom to choose whether or not to have an abortion. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only Senator to vote AGAINST the Act for Better Child Care of 1989. • Voted AGAINST Family and Medical Leave Act of 1990. • Voted AGAINST increasing funds for the WIC program at a time when N.C. has the highest infant mortality rate in the nation. • On Abortion—Supports Constitutional Amendment to deny women the right to choose whether or not to have an abortion.
DRUG ABUSE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ADVOCATES greater support for education and drug abuse programs in our elementary and secondary schools. • SUPPORTS alcohol and drug abuse rehabilitation programs and sees them as essential in a REAL, not rhetorical, war on drugs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Voted AGAINST Educational Excellence Act of 1990 which provides \$25 million for the drug free schools program. • Voted AGAINST primary health care block grants that focus on alcohol and drug abuse rehabilitation programs.
