

responsive when they have come in to work. They have taken their jobs very seriously. It is my guess that the people will grow up and be some of the strong leaders of tomorrow."

David Arant, an Elon College instructor who teaches a course in Politics in Mass Media, predicted that Helms would win the election. "Helms had the support of the older traditional North Carolina citizens who have very conservative values. Many of these people are just not going to vote for a black person," Arant said.

Arant said Helms gained a number of voters on the race issue. "He portrayed Gantt as being a supporter of the 1990 Civil Rights Act. Helms called this act a quota bill, an action that would have forced companies to come up with minority hiring quotas. These fears prompted some young white men to vote for Helms," Arant said.

Dr. Chalmers Brumbaugh, a political science professor at Elon, said, "Helms won because he was able to maintain the reservoir of the population that has supported

him for 18 years. He went into the rural areas of North Carolina and urged his followers to get out and vote. Helms centered his advertising campaign around the idea of making his traditional followers mad and giving them more incentive to vote."

All of Helms' election campaigns have been decided by narrow margins. His ranges of victory vary from obtaining 52 percent of the votes in the past two elections to obtaining 55 percent of the votes in 1978. According to Brumbaugh, 55 percent of the total vote has been considered the break even point for determining landslide victories.

Brumbaugh felt there was not much Gantt could have done to change the outcome of the race. "Gantt ran a fine race. I do not think there would need to be any major shifts in strategy. Maybe he could have mixed his personal biography with the issues. This would mean giving more reasons for why he supported particular causes. Gantt had quite a challenge considering 97 percent of the incumbant senators got re-elected," Brumbaugh said.

The set of directions for both programs are on reserve in the LRC. Alamance, Carlton and Mooney computer labs have access to these programs.

Anderson said.

The purpose of the agreement was to solidify the possibility of a long-term relationship between Elon and Southeast.

Dr. Wei was named president of Southeast University in 1987 and is the first woman to earn a doctorate in electronic engineering in China. Southeast University enrolls about 10,000 students. Southeast was formerly the

Nanjing Institute of Techology and renamed in 1988 when the curriculum was broadened to include liberal arts studies.

"We were honored for her to come to Elon. It was a rare experience," Anderson said.

Dr. Han Lijiang, professor of foreign languages at Southeast, is a visiting professor at Elon this year. Lijiang is teaching courses in the Chinese language and culture.
