Lodge to become botanical preserve


Dedication will be during Earth Week

Elon College officials plan to dedicate The Lodge as a permanent greenspace during Earth Week this year.

In April of 1990 a proposal was made for the college to consider designating the 26 acre tract of land as the official college arboretum. The proposal originated from a desire to maintain a "greenspace" close to campus to be developed and used for educational and environmental purposes.

Dr. Andrew J. Angyal, chair of the lodge and botanical preserve committee, said the college considers the botanical preserve to be well suited to its mission of preparing students for "service to their communities" and of



The preserve will be a recreation area and the site for educational programs for area residents.

encouraging "individual and collective responsibility for the environment."

The mission of the preserve will be the following:

■ To provide a conveniently located natural area for use in the teaching of botany, zoology and ecology. The preservation of this

property will provide a convenient outdoor laboratory.

■ To provide a natural environment suitable for ecological and field biology research projects.

■ To permit the college community to actively engage in
