"When I had my first inverview here, I said, 'Let me tell you about Elon College,'" Poindexter said, according to the Times-News.


Poindexter's position as assistant superintendent for personnel makes him responsible for hiring. He held a similar position at Burlington schools before joining Elon's staff in 1986.
