The different sashes were bright and eye-catching, adding quite a twist to the competition. Art Dornik, representing Kappa Sigma, sported a sash covered with bows of all colors and sizes.

The interview section helped the judges and the audience see which male was quickest on his feet. Questions ranged from "what article of clothing would you want be and why?" to "are you a toilet paper folder or a crumbler?"

The audience saw a little bit of everything in the talent competition. Art Dornik, the Kappa Sigma representative tugged at the hearts of females in the audience with his solo version of Nat King Cole's *Unforgettable*.
