THE PAST

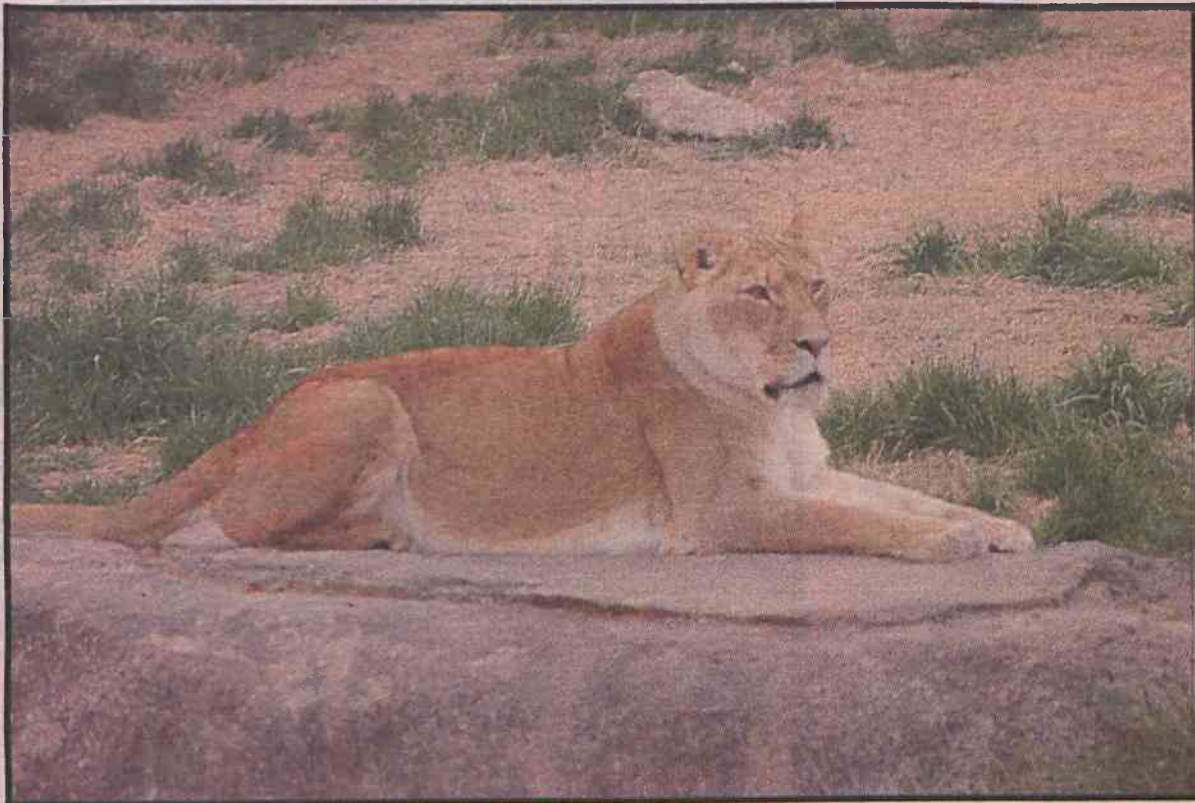

It's all happening at the zoo

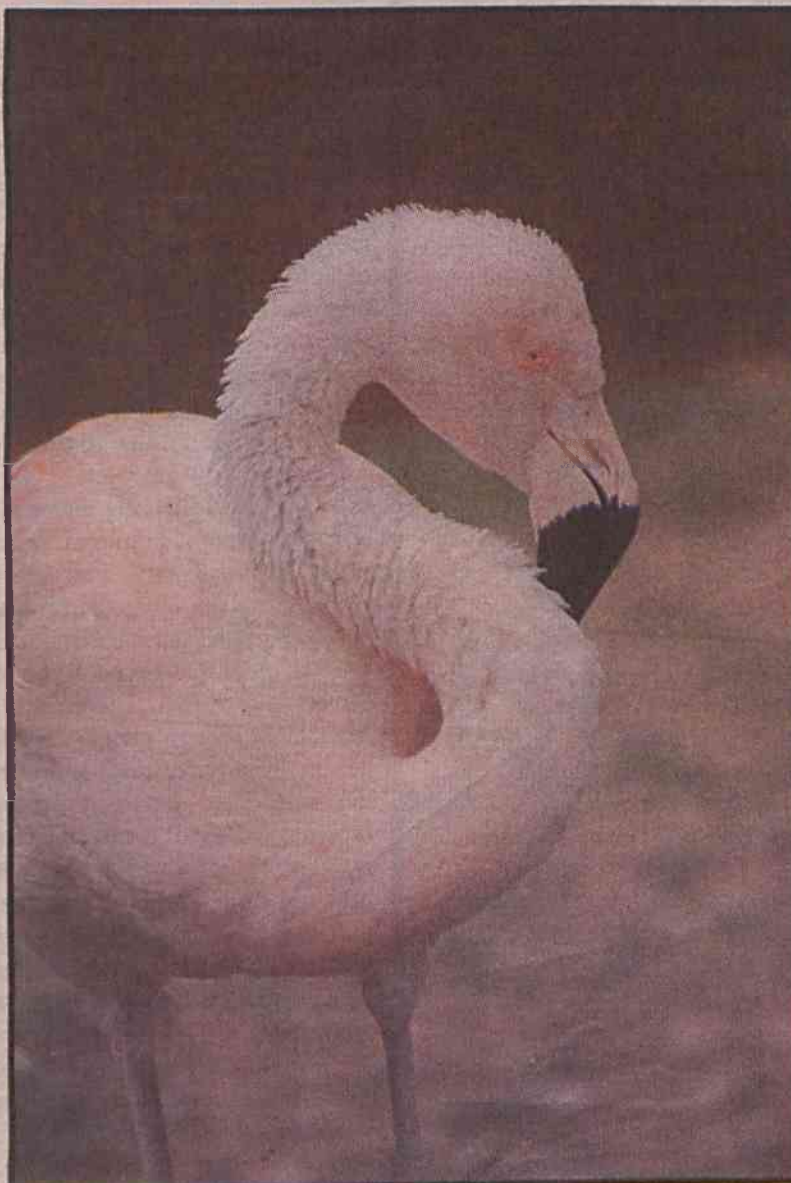

Gorillas, lions and all sorts of wild animals can be found within 60 miles of Elon College. They are located at the North Carolina Zoological Park in Asheboro, N.C.

The park is a natural habitat zoo spread over 1,448 acres. The park has eight outdoor and two indoor exhibits.

The African region covers 300 acres and has 2 miles of winding paths through wooded hills. While walking through this area, visitors can see Thompson's gazelles, impalas, Greater kudu and Saddle-bill storks roaming free on grassy plains.

The R.J. Reynolds Forest Aviary has more than 140 exotic birds and 2,400 plants. Many of the brightly colored birds lurk high up in the canopy of the forest so they are difficult to see, while others step out of the way
