Food Lion fights ABC's allegations

The charges range from bleached fish to rat-nibbled cheese.

The Food Lion grocery store chain is still reeling from an ABC investigative report on *Primetime Live* Thursday night, which exposed alleged unsanitary practices at their stores.

Footage from the hidden camera of an ABC producer posing as a meat wrapper in a North Carolina store showed workers re-wrapping old meat and changing expiration dates on packages to get more shelf life out of them.

Former employees spoke out against unrealistic workloads imposed by the company, which they said forced them to cut cleanliness corners.

Spokesmen for the Salisbury-based chain have accused ABC of

Habitat stands the cold for land
