Man-of-the-Year

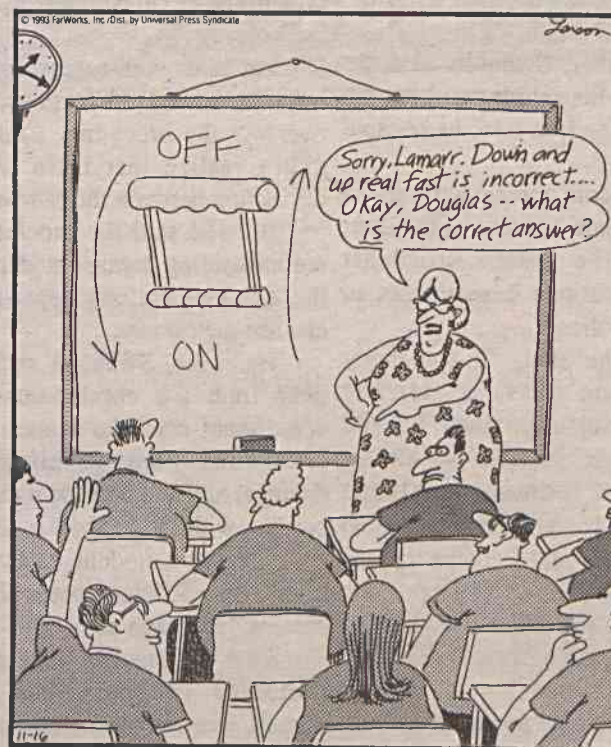
To the Editor:
