Elon students travel abroad during Winter Term

During January students attended class and received credit for work that wasn't all done on Elon's campus.

Winter term is a good opportunity for people to take part in study abroad trips.

One trip went to London to study various subjects such as English, fine arts, history and communications.

Students arrived in London and toured there for two weeks before taking a four-day trip to Scotland. Students then returned to London or traveled on their own for a week before heading to Amsterdam for a few days.

Crime Watch


