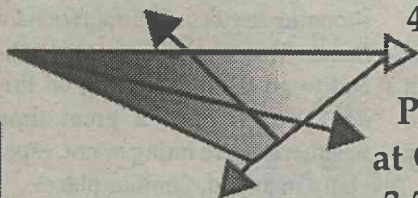

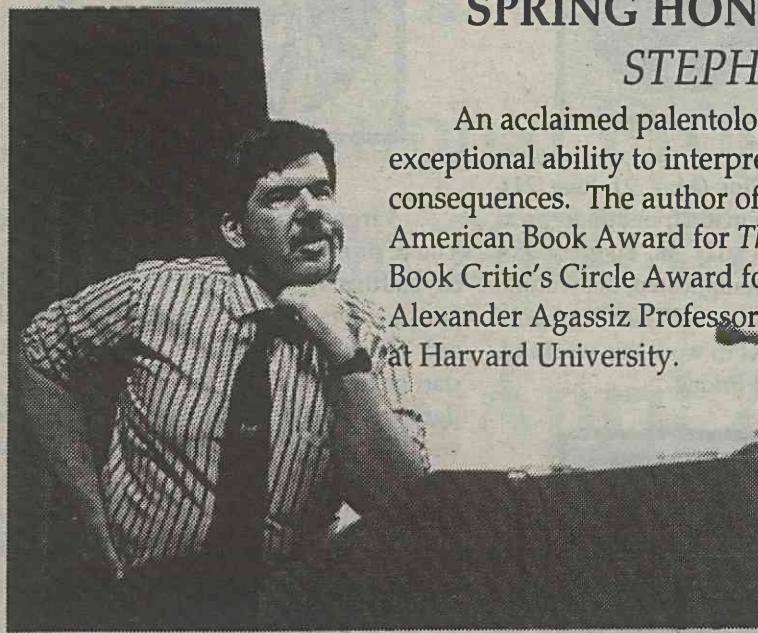

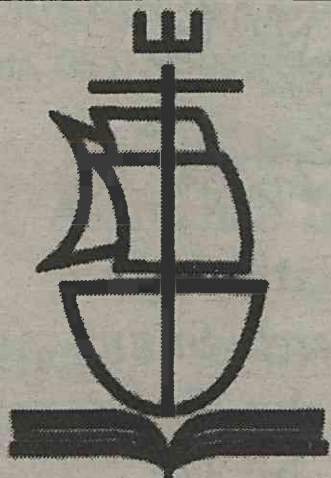
Academic Awareness
