Campus Bookstore sets the record straight on high prices

Got books? Even if they are used as coasters, chances are you got them at the Campus Bookstore. While some do make use of them, everyone is always bowled over with the price of books each semester. Many of us are forced to fork over at least \$300; most of which we will never see again, even with buybacks.

Where does all this money go? Joleene Alley, manager of the Campus Bookstore, set the record straight.

Barnes and Noble owns the bookstore. As the owners, they take about 67percent of profits for themselves and the publishers. Another 12percent combined goes to the author and freight company. So that leaves about 21percent of your money into the school.

Take out the 10 percent that pays employees and taxes and we're left with a whopping

11percent that actually goes into the school.

Elon could make books cheaper by giving up their 11percent of the profits, but that money helps to keep key programs running. The bookstore gives out ten semester scholarships to students who are in need. That's at least \$6,000 in new books given away each year.

Two lucky students will also get the chance to win free books for spring semester at basketball game, in November and December.

The bookstore also supports campus organizations. Many school associations such as Residence Life, the Baptist Student Union and the athletics teams receive donations for give-aways during games and events or money to support their group.

So next time you visit Varsity Books online for cheaper books or complain about prices, remember that the Bookstore is the only place that gives back to the community.


