The scholarship will provide assistance for one Jordanian student to come to Elon a year according to Sarah Peterson, assistant to the President. The first Jordanian will attend Elon in 2000-2001 school year.

"It's an exciting scholarship. Elon gets an international student from Jordan, and the student gets a quality education from Elon," Peterson said. Currently Queen Noor is president of United World Colleges and the chair of United Nations University International Leadership Academy in Jordan.

Her hope for a future that

benefits from education can be summed up by a quote by Robert F. Kennedy she said during her address, "Each time a person stands up for an ideal, or acts to improve the lot of others, or strikes out against injustice, he sends forth tiny ripple of hope, and crossing each other from a million different centers of energy and daring, these ripples build a current that can sweep down the mightiest walls of oppression and resistance. Only those who dare to fail greatly can ever achieve greatly. Some see things that are, and ask why. I dream of things that never were and ask why not."

The format was changed this year to allow for more participation. Assistant Director of Campus Recreation Michelle Zimmer said

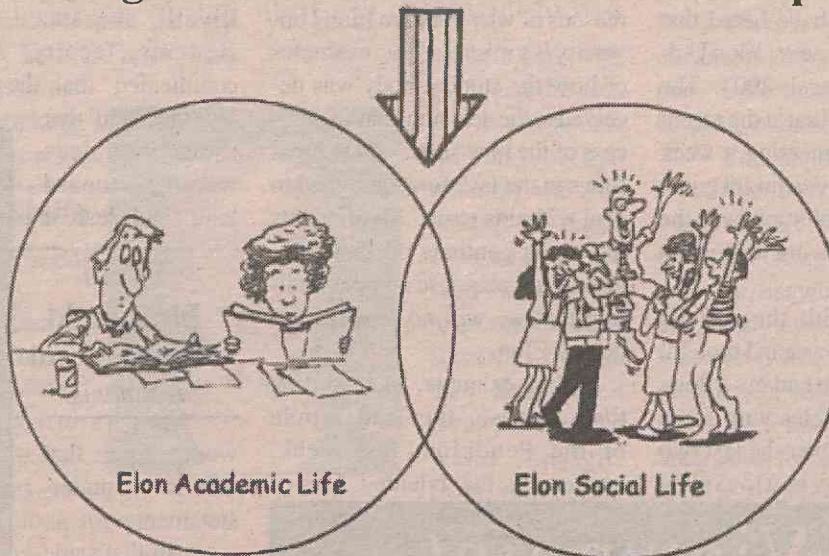
of this year's competition, "The teams this semester had a lot of respect for each other from the events and a better sense of community in their halls."

The intellectual world and the social world at Elon can overlap in interesting and creative ways. What ideas do you or your organization have to combine them?

You can request funding for projects and events. Academic Affairs has created project grants ranging from \$50 to \$500 for projects and activities that require some money for food, mailing, research, guest speakers, publicity, etc. Preference will be given to requests that clearly explain how academic and social aspects overlap, and for projects that include wide student representation (e.g., not limited to a single class).

Requesting money for your project is easy. Develop a plan. Have your plan reviewed by a faculty/staff member. Submit your request. It's that simple. To apply, pick up an application form in 120 Alamance.

This grant program is in response to recommendations from the 1998 Academic Summit, to coordinate learning and social activities, and to provide more opportunities for faculty and students to interact informally. A subcommittee of the Joint Deans' Board (Academics and Student Life) reviews applications and selects funding choices.

Deadlines for submitting proposals are November 1, 2000 & February 16, 2001

Nominations Are Open for Who's Who Award

Each year a national publication, "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges," solicits names of juniors, seniors and graduate students to be nominated by their college on the basis of outstanding scholastic, service and leadership performance.

Nominees who are accepted by Who's Who will be listed in the national Who's Who directory, and receive an award certificate, and be recognized locally and in their hometown newspaper. Students often include the recognition by Who's Who in their resume when searching for employment.

Juniors, seniors and graduate students with at least a 2.5 GPA are eligible for this award, and can nominate themselves by completing an application form available in Alamance 120. As specified on the form, students must submit a cover letter indicating their interest in being considered, and a resume. Letters of recommendation from faculty are allowed, but not required. The deadline for submitting completed application materials is November 1, 2000.

A committee of Elon College students, faculty, and Student Life staff will review applications and make nominations.
