he also warned about the naiveté of presidents during this crucial time."

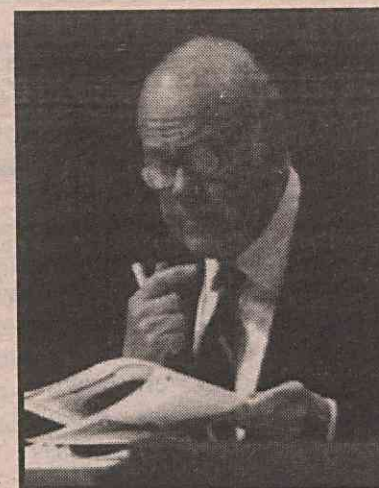
"During the first 100 days, you can also make your biggest mistakes," Gergen said. "You have the most power, but you know the least."

Gergen has served in the White House as an adviser to Presidents Nixon, Ford, Reagan and Clinton and is currently a professor of public service at Harvard University.

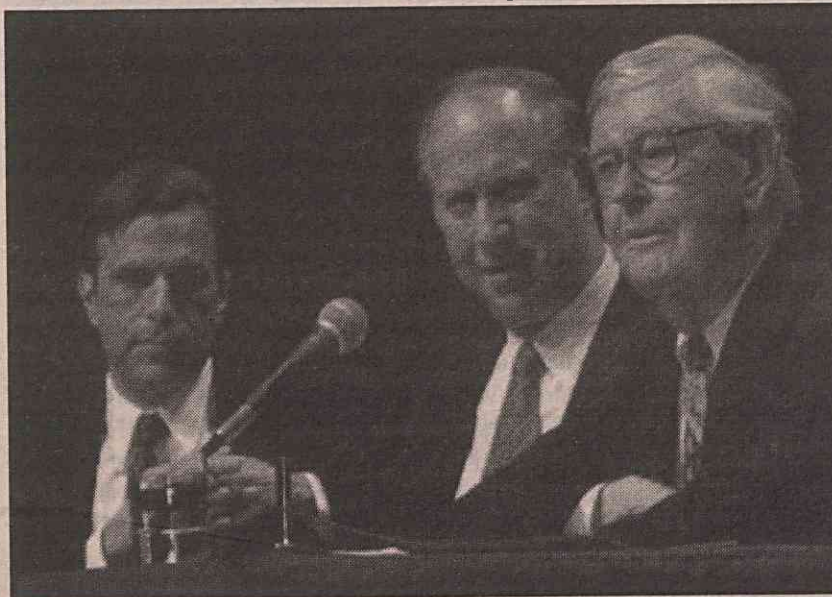
To conclude the evening of political analysis, Vanocur proposed the topic of the most recent election, which he believes the media played a major role in.

"The media played the role it has increasingly come to play, which is to confuse everyone," Vanocur said. "To the good of the American people, they took this in stride, making their own judgments relatively free of the bilge the mass media provided."

The panel agreed the chaotic election will have its consequences for the new president. "George W. Bush has passed the first test by

picking a Cabinet; he has a strong team," Gergen said. "Now he's got a tougher task to win: the confidence of the country as a leader."

Just as the symposium focused on the importance of the first 100 days of past presidents, they affirmed the same timeline would be used to measure Bush. "Come April 29, the phones will be ringing again," Leuchtenburg said. "We will be asked, how is George W. Bush doing, how does he measure up?"
