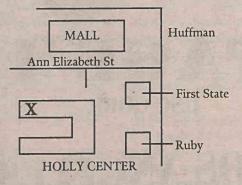
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Putting the right foot forward makes all the difference for football team

David Ware, #70, sophomore left guard from Chesapeake, Va.: "I will laugh or joke and listen to soothing music like Sade or Babyface."

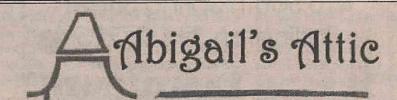
