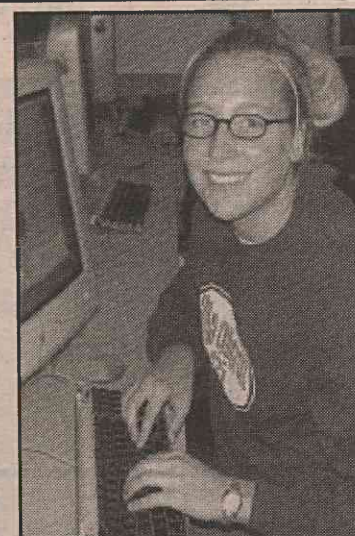
50 degree weather. Since the weather gods are not returning my calls, I will not rec-
