## Habitat for Humanity Homerun raises money for national campaign

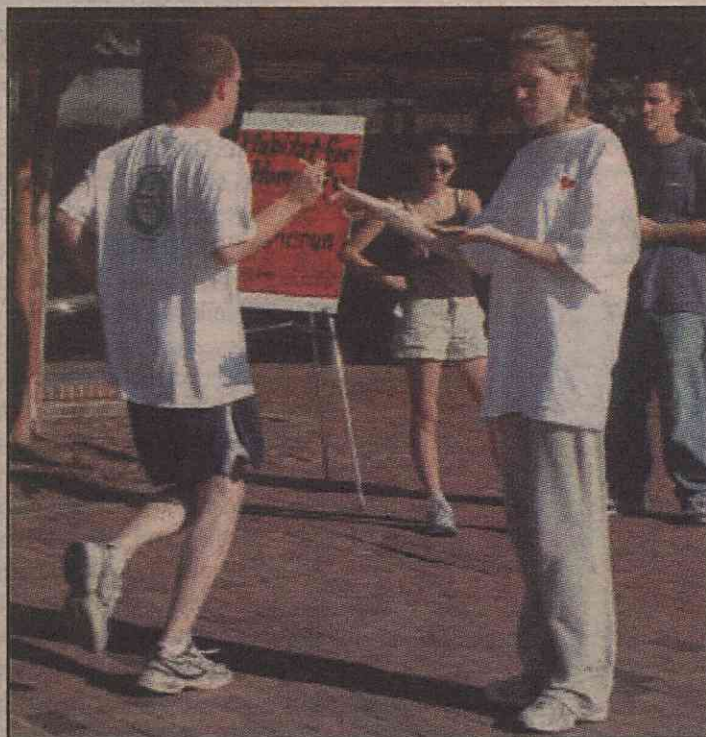
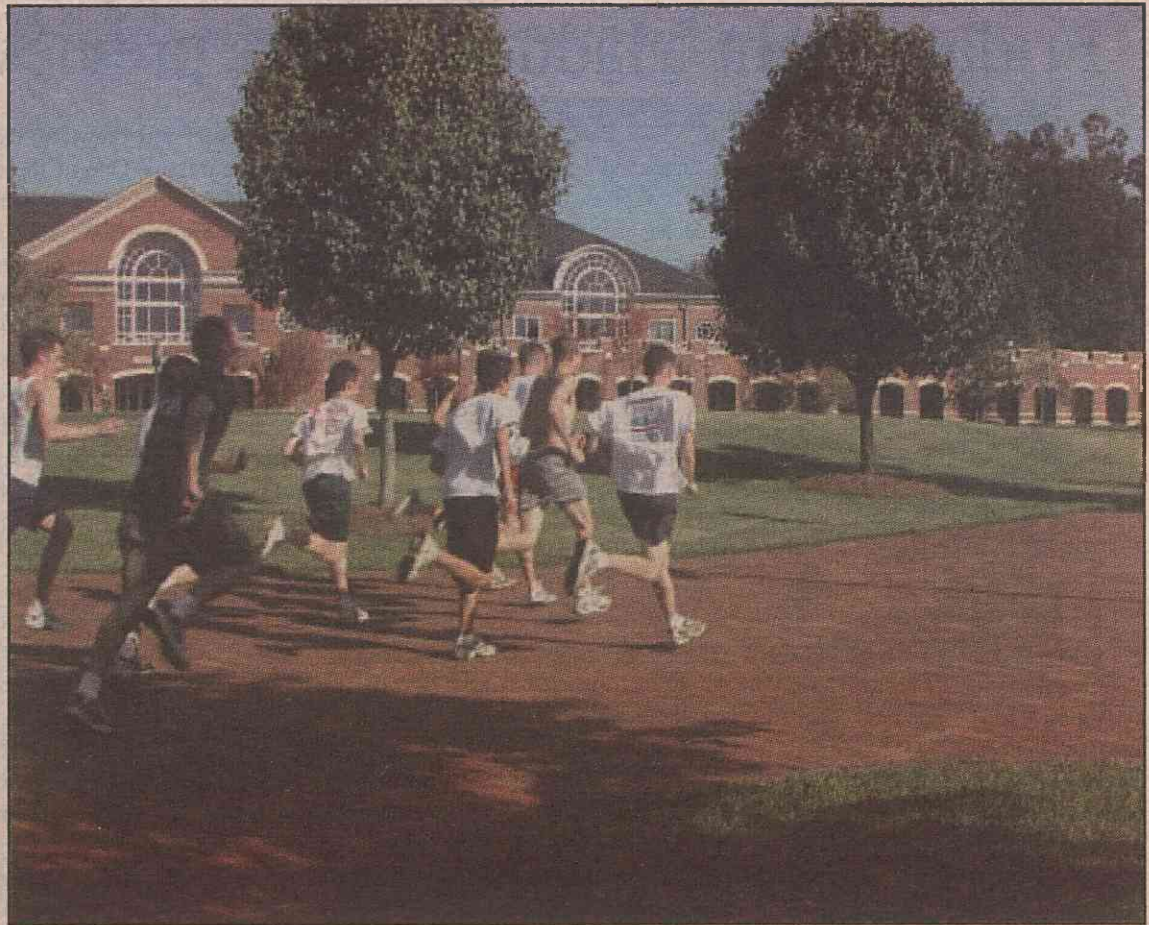
The Habitat for Humanity Homerun raised \$350 in donations this Saturday, October 20. 52 runners and walkers participated in the one-mile trail.
