

## Welcome to ELONIA by Ty Vrabel

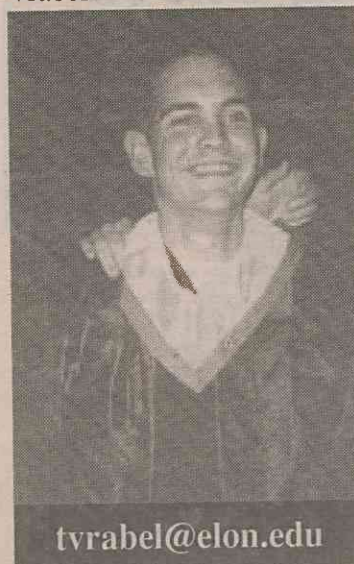

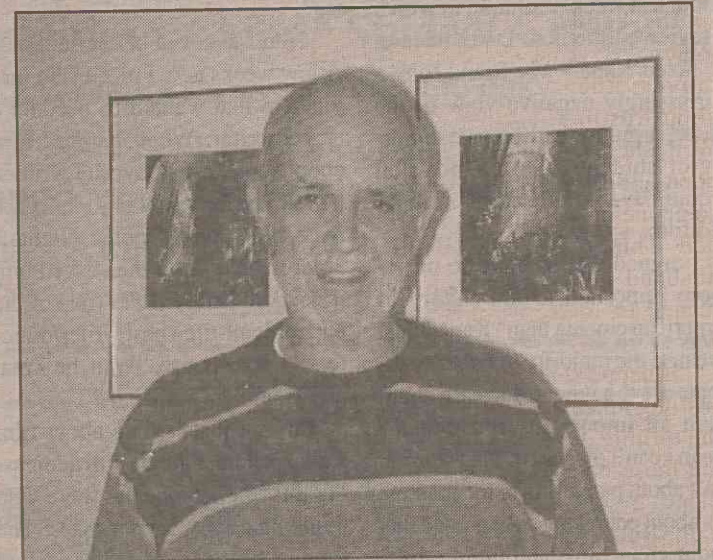
