
Online airfare: Total steal or bad deal?


Finding the cheapest airfare can be a daunting task. Buyers should be sure to comparison shop to find the best prices and values and get the most for their money.

s fall break nears, travelers across America will be logging on and calling in to search for the cheapest plane ticket to their destination. Many Web sites claim they can do the job; Orbitz.com, expedia.com, priceline.com and Travelocity.com are just a few. Who really has the lowest prices? Are these Web sites guaranteeing low prices, or the actual airlines making them possible?

For The Pendulum to solve this debate, four major cities were picked from four states most represented at Elon: Philadelphia, Baltimore, Richmond, Va., and Orlando, Fla. Best deal: Calling Delta gave the best deal yet: \$153. Cheaptickets.com was more than \$100 more, at \$271.
