Although students and faculty recognize College Coffee's importance in fostering a sense of community, fewer and fewer are making the extra effort to participate and keep the 19-yearold Tuesday morning tradition alive. In the event of inclement weather, College Coffee is moved to Moseley Center, but attendance is still declining.
