When submitting a piece, students are asked to include their Social Security numbers and title of the work on the top of the first page of each piece submitted. Submissions must be received in a hard copy and on a Mac-formatted computer disk.

Attach to each submission a separate index card with your Social Security number, title of work, name, campus box number, phone number and email address.

Poetry and fiction must be basically grammatically and mechanically correct or they will not be accepted. This year, photographs and artwork will be printed in color.
